## Additional Information

**Description:** A breakthrough in nasturtiums, creating a ball-like habit which is covered in flowers, rather than an untidy mess (Fleuroselect Winner 2020). Small, dark green leaves contrast beautifully against the tangerine orange flowers and these plants will help keep butterflies and blackfly away from brassicas and beans. Perfect to grow in the corners of your veg beds as they won't take over or swamp your veg or grow in old buckets (with holes for drainage) and you can move plants around the plot to help protect your veg. Leaves and petals can be added to salads, seedpods can be pickled and used as you would capers.

**Growing Information:** Sow directly into moist, warm, weed-free soil where they are to flower at a depth of 13mm. (Germination 7-14 days). As the seedlings develop, thin to 25cm (10") spacings. Alternatively, seeds can be started off in a 7.5cm pot and kept on a sunny windowsill until the last frost has passed.
